Question tags

What is it?

- A question tag is a short question at the end of a statement.
- Question tags are used when asking for agreement or confirmation.



QUESTION TAGS

It is difficult to get up early, isn't it ?

It isn't very easy to go back to school, is it ?

It was fun to be on holiday, wasn't it?

You were happy to be on holiday, weren't you ?

You weren't stressed with your homework, were you ?

Usually, you have got a lot of homework, haven't you ?

WHAT DID YOU DO DURING THE HOLIDAYS ?

- You had fun, didn't you?
- You spent time with your family, didn't you?
- Your parents gave you nice presents, didn't they?
- You didn't work a lot, did you ?

You didn't ask Santa a dictionary for Christmas, did you ?

You love Christmas, don't you?

QUESTION TAGS AND NOW, LET'S GO BACK TO WORK

Now, let's get back to work, shall we? + + Open your notebooks and write the date, will you? + +

With the verb "TO BE":

Repeat it in the question tag, but change the order:

She's a teacher, ____ isn't she These earrings aren't yours, <u>are they</u>? You were here last night, <u>weren't you</u>? She was really happy, <u>wasn't she</u> WATCH!!! I am a good listener, aren't l

With IMPERATIVES (commands or strong suggestions):

You use WON'T YOU or WILL YOU (sometimes also CAN, COULD or WOULD).

Sit down, <u>won't you</u>? Open the window, <u>will you</u> Don't go outside, <u>will you</u> Keep quiet, <u>won't you</u>?



Read aloud,

won't you?

With EVERY-, SOME-, NOTHING:

You use IT.
